Background

Mega-sporting events have recently been the subject of more and more public criticism, too often in the context of human rights violations, such as the FIFA World Cup in Qatar end of last year. However, sport and international sporting events have a great potential to respect and promote human rights especially when the actors who bear responsibility set an example. In order to support sport stakeholders in organizing their sporting events in the spirit of human rights, the Federal Ministry for Arts, Culture, the Civil Service and Sport (BMKOS) has published the handbook "International Sporting Events and Human Rights – A Handbook for Implementation in Austria".

Agenda

At the public panel discussion event sport, public and civil society stakeholders as well as representatives of EU member states are invited to exchange views on the promotion of human rights in the context of major sporting events in their countries, to identify best practices, and plan next steps together. The goal is to stimulate transfer of expertise as well as targeted and joint further action
